**FINANCIAL REPORT**

The Library Board was unable to review the current financial report as it had not been received by Ms. Kelley in time for the meeting.

**DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Sues reported on the following:

- December 2009 Circulation was 29,731 items. This puts us over 3,700 items ahead of last year, or an increase of almost 14 percent.
- Bids are being assembled for accessible doors for both ends of the lobby.
- Three more of our employees now hold a Masters degree in Library Science. These are Diane Santia, Dustin Brown and Keith Latinen. Congrats to them! Almost half the staff now has a professional library degree.
- I attended the ALA's Midwinter Meeting in Boston. Council meetings went more smoothly than most members have experienced. I chaired the Committee on Legislation's Subcommittee on Grassroots Advocacy. I also picked up an excellent collection development checklist for books in series, and the Strategic Planning book. I'm reading that now. In addition, I met informally with members of ALA's Executive Board and Executive Director. I attended several Intellectual Freedom (Committee and Round Table) meetings.
- Currently reading Strategic Planning for Public Libraries. Will create informal presentation with preliminary information to discuss at February's meeting.

**c. Automation/Internet/E-Books**

Netbooks is currently on the library website with instructions on how to use. Ms. Keefer followed the directions step by step and could not complete the program. Who provided the instructions?

Mr. Suss will find out who authored the directions (outside company or Library) and provide feedback at February's Library Board meeting.

**d. Long Range Plan**

Suggestions on keeping public informed of various services Library offers and how to be of value to residents:

- Notify patrons on lobby TV of number of people using library on daily/weekly or monthly basis
- Prepare in advance for upcoming renewal of mileage
- Working with Ralph C. Richardson Center to reach as many seniors as possible. Educate them on services Library offers, etc.
- Rental fees for library materials
- Library needs to be valuable to the community. Talk with staff for suggestions on how to best serve patrons especially with technology making a lot of printed materials obsolete.
- Partnering with local schools. High schools do not have librarians this year due to budget cuts from the State. Offer support to schools and reach out to parents proving the value of the Library which would help support renewal of future mileages. (Commerce Township has more high schools than all surrounding communities)
- Sponsor a school night – could include tutors, school project assistance, etc.
- Keeping up with public demands.
