Community Description



The Charter Township of Commerce Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan (2019-2023) was prepared and adopted by the Township Park and Recreation Committee and Township Board to serve as a guide and decision making document for future recreation facilities and programs. The Plan presents an inventory of existing facilities and programs within the Township as well as an evaluation of opportunities and priorities. Taking into account the existing facilities, as well as anticipated demand for improvements, the Plan presents goals, guidelines and a 5-year action plan.

Although the Charter Township of Commerce works closely and cooperatively with several public and private agencies that provide recreation opportunities, the jurisdiction of this Master Plan includes only Township-owned and operated recreation facilities and programs.

The Plan is also intended to enable the Township to continue to apply for funding assistance from various agencies and work toward implementing the documented recommendations. This Plan provides for five years of grant eligibility with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR).

Commerce Township is located in the southwestern portion of Oakland County, within the greater Detroit metropolitan area. Oakland County is the second largest county in Michigan with a population of well over one million. As of the 2010 Census, Commerce Township had a population of 35,874 residents, an 18.2% increase (5,525 people) from 2000 and a July 2017 population estimate of 38,170 (SEMCOG).

Although Commerce Township was once a rural agricultural and lake resort area, the predominant character has changed over the years to more of a low-density suburban, lake setting. The majority of development has occurred in the form of residential subdivisions, but commercial, office and institutional developments also dot the landscape. In particular, non-residential land uses are concentrated in the southeastern portion

of the Township along M-5 and Haggerty Road. Although much development has occurred over the years, the Township continues to be home to a significant amount of open space in the form of parkland, golf courses, and conservation lands, the largest of which includes the Proud Lake State Recreation Area. The Township's many small to mid-sized lakes are also a significant natural amenity.

As shown in the Regional Setting Map, the Charter Township of Commerce is bordered by: White Lake Township to the north; Milford Township to the west; the Village of Wolverine Lake and Cities of Wixom, Novi and Walled Lake to the south; and West Bloomfield Township to the east. The major transportation arteries in the area include I-96, I-275, I-696 and M-5, which extends into the Township from the south. These highways effectively connect Commerce Township with the rest of the Detroit Metropolitan Area.



Planning Process



This section of the Master Plan provides a general description of the planning and public input process used for the Commerce Township Five-Year Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan.

Background Studies

Data collection and fieldwork for the background studies began in the Summer of 2018. Various sources were utilized to gather the most upto-date information including: Township staff, the previous Commerce Township Recreation Plan, the Airline Trail Master Plan, Oakland County Trails Master Plan, governmental and organizational websites, and field observations.

The Community Description includes a brief introduction to the Township, the jurisdiction of the Plan and the focus of the Plan.

The Administrative Structure chapter of the Plan describes how recreation is governed and operated within the Township. This includes information gathered from the Township outlining staff responsibilities, the function of the Parks and Recreation Director, and a fiscal analysis (as it relates to recreation) of the last few years.

The Inventory chapter provides an inventory of the recreation facilities within Commerce Township. This information was collected through a field survey conducted in May and June of 2018. The location of each facility was described and mapped, as well as the various programs, activities, and events offered throughout the Township. The chapter also identifies public school, regional, and private recreation facilities in and around Commerce Township.

The Community Description, Inventory, and Administrative Structure chapters were presented to the Parks and Recreation Committee at their November 26, 2018 meeting for review and revisions.

Basis For Action

The Basis For Action section of the Master Plan analyzes factors inside and outside of the Township that may have an affect on the direction of recreation over the next five years. This portion of the plan provides the rationale for the goals, guidelines and priority capital improvements. Several factors were analyzed including current national trends, comparison to other similar sized communities (national data), service area gaps, existing plans and reports, and results of input gathered at a public workshop and online opinion survey. The draft "Basis For Action" was presented to the Parks and Recreation Committee for their review and discussion at their November 26, 2018 meeting.

Online Opinion Survey

An online parks, recreation and trails opinion survey was developed using the parks survey done in 2013 as a beginning. The survey went live on August 20, 2018 and was open until September 28, 2018. The availability of the survey was published on the Township website, distributed via email, posted to the Township Facebook page, and flyer's were hung at the Richardson Center and Township Hall. In total, 340 people participated in the survey. A summary of the results of the online survey is provided in Appendix A.

Public Workshop

The Township and Parks and Recreation Committee hosted a public workshop on September 18, 2018 to brainstorm ideas and identify priorities for the next 5 years. Approximately 15 people attended the workshop held at the Richardson Center. Participants brainstormed ideas that were then documented on flip charts throughout the room. Attendees placed sticker dots (3 per person) next to the items they believed were their highest priority. Attendees also noted on a large map their top 3 destinations they do/would like to walk or bike to in the Township.

Action Plan

The Action Plan section of the Master Plan outlines the direction that the Township would like to take over the next five years in order to maintain and improve recreation opportunities within the community. The Action Plan includes goals and guidelines as well as a capital improvements schedule. The Committee reviewed and discussed the goals, objectives and capital improvement priorities at their November 26 and December 17, 2018 meetings. Comments were noted and edits made prior to the draft being made available for public review. The Non-Motorized System Map and Action Plan section was reviewed with Township staff in December as well as a sub-

committee comprised of representatives of Township staff, Parks and Recreation Committee and Township Board in January 2019 in order to have a broad discussion and overview.

Public Hearing

A full draft Five-Year Master Plan was presented to the Parks and Recreation Committee for their review and discussion on December 17, 2018. Discussion was focused on the Action Plan section. The Committee agreed with the general direction and overall goals related to the Non-Motorized elements, but requested the Non-Motorized System Plan be reviewed by a subcommittee prior to release to the public in order to discuss in more detail.

The draft Master Plan was then made available for public review on January 25, 2019. Hard copies of the draft Plan were available at the Township Hall and the Ralph C. Richardson Center. A digital copy was posted to the Township website. A notice was published in the Oakland Press on January 25, 2019 and posted on the Township website, Facebook page and in Township Hall and the Ralph C. Richardson Center, making people aware of the draft Plan and public hearing.

A public hearing on the draft Five-Year Master Plan was held in front of the Parks and Recreation Committee on February 25, 2019 at the Township Hall.

A summary of comments and discussion at the public hearing are included in the Appendix.

Adoption

The Commerce Township Parks and Recreation Committee adopted the Parks, Recreation and Trail Master Plan by Resolution at their regular meeting on February 25, 2019.

The Commerce Township Board of Trustees adopted the Parks, Recreation and Trail Master Plan by Resolution at their regular meeting on March 12, 2019.

Administrative Structure



This section describes how recreational activities and resources are governed and administered within the Charter Township of Commerce. The function of the various entities with recreation responsibilities and the overall administrative hierarchy of the Township is outlined. Additionally, Township expenditure and revenue trends are summarized.

Public Act 156 of 1917 authorizes cities, villages, counties, townships, and school districts to operate local recreation facilities and recreation systems. The Act states that a city, village, county or township may operate a system of public recreation and playgrounds, acquire, equip and maintain land, buildings or other recreation facilities, employ a superintendent of recreation and assistants and vote and expend funds for the operation of systems.

Township Board

The ultimate authority for the provision of recreation in the Township is held by the seven member Township Board including the Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer and four Trustees. The Township Board approves the recreation budget, appoints and supervises the activities of the Parks and Recreation Committee, and oversees the activities of the Senior Services/Parks and Recreation Department. Additionally, the Township Board is responsible for the long-term recreation vision within the Township through the adoption of a 5-year Recreation Master Plan.

Parks and Recreation Committee

The Parks and Recreation Committee consists of seven members, one of which is a Township Board member while the remainder are citizens appointed by the Township Board. The Committee has three officers, a chairperson, vice-chairperson and secretary. The Committee plays an important role in the long-term recreational vision within the Township by overseeing the development of a 5-Year Master Plan and providing a recommendation for adoption to the Board. Working within the annual budget, the Committee provides recommendations to the Township Board for recreational activities including capital expenditures, athletic

league programming, senior programming, maintenance activities and other projects and initiatives that are undertaken each year.


Senior Services/Parks and Recreation Director

To manage day-to-day recreational activities, the Township has a Senior Services/Parks and Recreation Director to serve under the Township Board and assist the Parks and Recreation Committee. The Director is responsible for the following activities:

- Serves as facilitator for the various sports leagues operating within he Township including coordination of league locations;
- Coordinate the use of multiple recreation facilities;
- Recommends land, facility expansions and additional needs to the Parks and Recreation Committee and Township Board;
- Works closely with maintenance personnel to ensure park maintenance;
- Develops and coordinates the various senior services offered within the Township;

- Staffs the Ralph C. Richardson Center; and,
- Monitors and administers the Township's Recreation Fund.

The Director reports to the Township Supervisor and serves as technical staff for the Parks and Recreation Committee. Other staff members include an Assistant to Director, Administrative Clerk (part-time), Director of Maintenance, Maintenance Supervisor, and three to six additional seasonal maintenance staff (one full-time and two part-time). Although the maintenance staff work with the Senior Services/Parks and Recreation Director, they report directly to the Township Supervisor.



Fiscal Analysis

The provision of recreation within Commerce Township is funded through two primary means: the Township's General Fund (property tax revenues); and the Park Improvement and Creation and Acquisition of Open Space Millage. To a lesser extent, the provision of recreation is also supported by donations and grants. The following Table details the parks and recreation revenues and expenditures within Commerce Township for 2016 through 2018.

The revenues received from the Park Improvement and Creation and Acquisition of Open Space Millage are designated for recreation capital improvements and acquisition, along with related expenses. Millage Funds can not be expended on "General" expenditures such as salaries, maintenance, etc. For the 2016 through 2018 fiscal years, the millage resulted in revenues between \$638,000 to \$700,000 each year. The millage revenue has been rebounding over the past several years as property values have risen. Interest and dividends from the fund and donations have supplemented the total millage revenues. In 2016, the Township expended approximately \$164,000 of the millage fund on capital purchases and other expenses. In 2017, millage expenditures significantly increased due to the renovations and expansion of the Ralph C. Richardson Center.

The Township's day-to-day recreational operations are funded through the Township's General Fund (property tax revenues). These expenditures include salaries and benefits for staff, operating expenses for the Ralph C. Richardson Center, equipment maintenance, building and grounds maintenance, Board fees and contractual services. The Township's General Recreation Expenditures have risen over the past three years by approximately \$100,000 primarily reflecting additional staff and increasing medical insurance costs.

Inventory



Developing a complete inventory of recreation facilities, programs and events is an essential component of a Master Plan. This chapter of the plan provides a base of information to use in developing the Action Plan. Understanding what facilities, programs, and events are available to the residents of Commerce Township is an important step in the future decision-making process.

This portion of the plan includes several components. The first component is a description of the recreation facilities and programs that Commerce Township owns and operates. Recreation, social and cultural facilities located within the Township, but owned and operated by outside agencies such as the public school district, were also inventoried. A description of regional recreation facilities is also provided. The facilities inventory is followed by an assessment of the barrier-free compliance status of Township-owned park facilities. Lastly, this chapter includes a description of the facilities that were partially or completely acquired and/or developed using recreation grant funding from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR).

Commerce Township Parks

In total, Commerce Township owns and operates 12 public parks encompassing more than 1200 acres of land. The location of each of Commerce Townships parks is shown on the Inventory Map. Each park is designated as having a particular functional classification, based on a system developed by the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA). The three functional park classifications include Community Park, Neighborhood Park and Mini-Park. Community parks are designed to serve a large population base and meet community-wide recreation needs. Neighborhood parks are the basic unit of the park system and serve as the recreational and social focus of a particular neighborhood. Mini-parks are intended to address limited, isolated or unique recreational needs within a small area.

In order to collect the most up-to-date facility information for each of the parks, a field survey was conducted in May 2018. The results of the survey are compiled into a table which provides a comprehensive inventory of the parks and various facilities within each park.

Commerce Township Grant History and Park Property Encumbrances

When preparing a Recreation Plan, the Michigan Department of Natural Resources requires that information be provided concerning grants that have been received in the past for acquisition or development of recreation facilities. The recreation grant history was obtained from the MDNR, Grants Management Division and noted on each park property profile sheet. Complete post-inspection completion forms for each of the parks that have received MDNR funding are included in the appendix.

Barrier Free Status of Commerce Township Parks

With the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), all areas of public service and accommodation became subject to barrier-free requirements, including parks and recreation facilities and programs. To evaluate the status of the existing public parks and recreation facilities owned by Commerce Township, each was inventoried for their accessibility status (as defined by the MDNR) during a field survey conducted in May 2018. Each facility was given a rating of 1 through 5 with the following MDNR definitions:

- 1. None of the facilities/park areas meet guidelines;
- 2. Some of the facilities/park areas meet guidelines;
- 3. Most of the facilities/park areas meet guidelines;
- 4. Entire park meets guidelines; and,
- 5. Entire park was developed/renovated using principals of universal design.



Bicentennial Park

2840 Fisher

Classification: Neighborhood Park

Acres: 9.75 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

MDNR Grants: LW 26-00880 (1977) LW 26-01060 T2 (1978)

Bicentennial Park is located north of Glengary Road, behind the former Township Hall Building on Fisher Avenue. Developed for recreational purposes in 1976, during the year of the U.S. Bicentennial, this park features a variety of active recreational facilities- although most are in fair to poor condition. Amenities include one ball field, one soccer field, two sand volleyball courts, two tennis courts (not currently usable due to condition), one basketball court and one horseshoe pit. Facilities for younger children include a playscape, swingset and slide. One pavilion is available, along with picnic tables, grills and a porta-john.

Grant Status:

Grants received in the late 1970's were for the shelter/storage building, tennis court fencing, playground, and boundary fence. Shelter/storage building is still used although showing signs of age. Tennis courts are no longer usable due to age. A master plan for improvements to the park are planned in the coming years. A cell tower conversion was resolved in 2016.







Byers Homestead Park

213 Commerce Road

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 2.32 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 2

The historically significant Byers Homestead Park is a small park located on the south side of Commerce Road and situated along the Huron River. The property was first settled in 1825 by Abram Walrod, the first European settler in Commerce Township. Many of the historic buildings remain on the site including the primary residence that was built in 1849. The Byers homestead site was listed on the State register of historic sites on May 28, 1977. The Friends of Byers formed in 1995 in recognition of the need to protect the homestead for future generations to enjoy.

In 1998, Commerce Township purchased the property for preservation as a historic and recreational community amenity. The Friends group works closely with the Township to coordinate the preservation and maintenance of the grounds, conduct community events and assist with fundraising for maintenance and preservation.

Facilities at the park include the primary residence, barn, duck barn, pantry, storage barn, outhouse, picnic tables, benches, walking path, porta-john and a wooden bridge over the Huron River. The park also hosts a number of events throughout the year such as vintage market, Halloween boo bash, pictures with Santa and the Easter bunny, etc.









Dodge Park 5

180 Commerce Rd 4380 S Commerce Rd

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 112.75 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

Dodge Park is a community park at the southeast corner of Commerce Road and South Commerce Road. The park was donated by the Dodge family to the State and became part of the State Park system. During the 1930's, workers from the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) participated in a tree planting program at the park, portions of which are still present today. In the 1990's, Commerce Township purchased the park from the State for preservation as a park site.

A significant project that added an access road, parking area, 2 soccer fields, pavilions, play equipment, picnic tables and grills to the south side of the park was completed in 2009. CW3 soccer maintains the soccer fields. The project was completed as part of a larger vision for the property as was documented in the 2006 master plan. The park is also the home of special events such as summer concerts and movies.

The new, 35,000 square foot Commerce Township Library was opened in 2017 in the northwest portion of the property. Near the library there is open space, bike racks, dog waste stations, a picnic pavilion, a new footbridge and trails connecting to the southern portion of Dodge Park.

As is illustrated on the Dodge Park 2018 Conceptual Layout Plan, in 2019/2020, several additional amenities and facilities are planned at Dodge Park including a third soccer field (built and maintained by CW3), a universally accessible playground and splash pad (to be built by the Scarlet's Smile Foundation), as well as a restroom/changing room building. Additional parking is being considered in future years if deemed necessary with the additional facilities.








Dodge Park Conceptual Layout Plan 2018

Hickory Glen Park

610 Glengary Road

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 152.76 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

Hickory Glen Park is located on the north side of Glengary Road in the central portion of the Township. The community park is both an active and passive park with many sporting facilities, including seven mid- to full-sized ball diamonds and one full size football stadium. Bleachers and dugouts are found at each ball field with a grandstand, concession stand, restrooms, and scoreboard at the football stadium. Working in conjunction with the Township, the Lakes Athletic Association maintains the ball diamonds while the Hawks Youth Football League maintains the football stadium. Other facilities at the park include play equipment, picnic tables, grills, benches and a concession building.

The Motor City Mountain Bike Association has built and maintains numerous mountain bike trails within the park. The Lakes Community Trail extends through the park, providing opportunities for walking, jogging and biking. The trail also provides a link between Hickory Glen Park and other recreation facilities within the area. A long-term Master Plan for the park was developed in 2011. The log cabin at the southwest corner of the park is leased out and not available.

Robert H. Long Nature Park 40900 14 Mile Rd

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 117.51 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

MDNR Grants: TF91-045



The Robert H. Long Nature Park is located on the northeast corner of 14 Mile Road and M-5 in the southeast corner of the Township. This nature park affords citizens access to a wetland habitat and offers opportunity for the enjoyment of nature and wildlife. Dedicated in 1995, the park was a cooperative project between Commerce Township, the Township Downtown Development Authority (DDA) and a private developer donation.


A major feature of this park is a handicapped accessible crushed limestone trail that encircles Berry Lake. A covered bridge connects the north and south sides of the trail. Other amenities include fishing docks, a picnic pavilion, picnic tables, grills and benches. The M-5 Trail traverses along the east side of the park.

Grant Status:

Grants received in the early 1990s were for acquistion of 7 acres and development of trails, dam, parking, picnic area, etc. All facilities remain usable and open to the public.









Maple Glen Park

2355 Glengary Road

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 115.12 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

Located on the south side of Glengary Road, in the south central portion of Commerce Township, Maple Glen Park was purchased in the 1960s and has since been developed primarily for baseball and softball purposes. Currently, two leagues call the park home: Interlakes Girls Softball League and Commerce Little League. Through generous donations, the two leagues have constructed a total of 15 ball fields of various sizes and provide field maintenance. Related amenities include outdoor bathrooms, concessions, maintenance building, play equipment, bleachers, picnic tables, grills, benches and a batting cage. The Lakes Community Trail travels through the park from east to west.

A long-term master plan was developed for Maple Glen Park in 2011 with a focus on adding an additional ingress/egress, organizing parking, adding additional ballfields, developing soccer fields, improving pedestrian circulation and wayfinding and related amenities. The finger of property on the eastern side of the park is slated for cemetery expansion.


In 2016, a second ingress/egress, parking lot and trail connections were built in the northeast portion of the park.

Mill Race Park

360 Commerce Road

Classification: Mini Park
Acres: 8.23
MDNR Accessibility Rating: 1

MDNR Grants: TF878 (1984)

Mill Race Park is located on the north side of Commerce Road across from Byers Homestead Park. Mill Race Park is a State Registered Historical Site, formerly occupied by the Commerce Roller Mill. The property was in the original platted village in 1825. The Commerce Roller Mill was built in 1837 and operated for 90 years, serving the farming communities within the area. Processing flour and ground feed for livestock, the mill served as the center of commercial activity in the Township for many years. The site was purchased by the Township for recreational purposes in 1984.

Used primarily as a passive open space area and interpretive site, with a picnic table and an internal trail network with two bridges crossing the Huron River headwaters. Parking exists behind the Mill Race Shopping Center, on Carroll Lake Road as well as informal parking along Commerce Road.

Grant Status:

Grant was received in 1984 to purchase 4 acres. All facilities remain usable and open to the public.










Ralph C. Richardson Park/Center 1485 E Oakley Park Rd

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 78.35 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

The Ralph C. Richardson Community Center and Park is a focal point for recreation activity within Commerce Township. The park and community center is located on the northwest corner of Oakley Park Road and Newton Road. The majority of the park site is wooded open space and unique prairie, accessed by nature trails. Outdoor facilities include one small soccer field, sand volleyball court, two playscapes, swings, horseshoe pit, picnic tables, grills and benches.

The Community Center was significantly renovated in 2017 and 2018. The multi-purpose facility is used as a senior center and by residents and organizations for special events on a rental basis for weddings, gatherings, etc.. Senior activities and programs are held at the center throughout the year, such as cards and lunches. A new, large, outdoor patio overlooks the rear portion of the park.









Snowy Ridge Park

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 3.48 MDNR Accessibility Rating: 3

Snowy Ridge Park is located on the west side of Welch Road just south of the Township Wastewater Treatment Plant. The park was opened in 2013 and includes the area's only sled hill and an associated parking area.







Victory Park 9061 Wise Road

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 334.25 MDNR Accessibility Rating: N/A

The Township acquired Wise Woods and Victory Park from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources in 2012. The Township purchased the property from the State to be used for public outdoor recreation. The southern portion of the property, previously known as the Proud Lake Recreation Area- East Unit, was partially used in the 1950s as a Nike missile base by the U.S. Department of Defense.

The Township subsequently named the portion of the property south of Wise Road, Victory Park. The southern portion includes woods, the former Nike missile site, open fields, streams, wetlands and informal trails.

Deed restrictions focus on conservation and wildlife habitat protection with active, outdoor recreation facilities permitted in and around the former Nike missile area on the south parcel. Parks millage money was instrumental in obtaining ownership of the property.

A long-term master plan was developed for the Wise Woods/Victory Park property in 2014 with a focus on passive recreation and trails throughout both properties with more active recreation in Victory Park including a large pavilion with restrooms, parking, dog park, soccer fields, open space, playground and splash pad.







Wise Woods 9061 Wise Road

Classification: Community Park

Acres: 266.98 MDNR Accessibility Rating: N/A

The Township acquired Wise Woods and Victory Park from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources in 2012. The Township purchased the property from the State to be used for public outdoor recreation.

The Township subsequently named the portion of property north of Wise Road, Wise Woods. The north portion of the park is undeveloped with woods, streams, wetlands and informal trails.

Deed restrictions focus on conservation and wildlife habitat protection with active, outdoor recreation facilities permitted in and around the former Nike missile area on the south parcel. Parks millage money was instrumental in obtaining ownership of the property.

A long-term master plan was developed for the Wise Woods/Victory Park property in 2014 with a focus on passive recreation and trails throughout both properties with more active recreation in Victory Park.

Township Recreation Programs and Partners

The Charter Township of Commerce, in conjunction with several recreational leagues, offers a variety of programs and services for the citizens of the Township and region. A description of these programs and the various recreational leagues is provided on the following pages.

Senior Programs

Senior citizen activities are offered throughout the year, primarily at the Ralph C. Richardson Center. Some of the senior activities include:

- Computer lab
- Bingo
- Yoga
- Cards
- Knit, crochet and sewing
- Blood pressure clinics
- Hearing evaluation
- Woodcarving
- Soup, sandwich and movie day
- Art

Transportation services are offered to seniors and those with disabilities to/from the Richardson Center, doctors, malls, grocery, banks, etc. Senior luncheons are held Monday- Friday at the Richardson Center. Each month, a free theme luncheon, such as western or baseball, is offered to seniors. The Township organizes day trips and extended trips for seniors throughout the year.

Concert in the Park

The Township organizes a family friendly Concert in the Park event. It will be held 8 times in 2019. Previous years, it was held at Dodge Park but may move to other parks in the Township. Events include music, face painting, food vendors and more. Concerts are held in June, July and August.

Commerce Little League

Active for more than 65 years, the Commerce Little League uses and maintains baseball fields at Maple Glen Park. The league offers both a fall and spring baseball and tee-ball season to youth between the ages of 5 and 14. The league is headed by a Board of Directors which meets monthly.

Lakes Athletic Association

The Lakes Athletic Association is a regional baseball association that is open to Commerce Township youth and utilizes several of the Township's ball fields, primarily those at Hickory Glen Park and school district ballfields. Various leagues have been set up based

on the age of the participant, ranging from 4-6 year old tee ball to 17-19 years old. The primary season is spring, however, a fall ball season is also offered.

Inter-Lakes Girls Softball

Established in 1972, ILGSL is one of the largest recreational softball leagues for girls ages 5-14. The organization offers slowpitch and fastpitch softball for girls within Commerce Township and the surrounding areas. The league utilizes 7 ball fields and operates a concession stand at Maple Glen Park. ILGSL has been nationally recognized by USSSA.

CW3 Soccer Association

The CW3 Soccer Association is a youth soccer association serving Commerce Township, Walled Lake, Wixom and Wolverine Lake. Soccer is offered for boys and girls from U4 through U18. CW3 is a fully-registered Michigan non-profit organization managed by a Board of Directors. Games are played at middle schools, Northern High School and Dodge Park fields. CW3 maintains the soccer fields at Dodge Park.

Lakes Area Hawks Youth Football and Cheerleading League

The football field (Lesner Field) at Hickory Glen Park is the home of the Lakes Area Hawks Youth Football and Cheerleading League. The Hawks field three football teams based on age from 7-14 years old. The cheerleading squads are divided into three groups: Freshman, JV and Varsity. During the fall, the Hawks football teams and cheerleading squads face off against other teams in southeast Michigan.

Motor City Mountain Bike Association

The Motor City Mountain Biking Association chapter of the International Mountain Biking Association is a section 501c3 advocacy organization focused on preserving, protecting, and promoting mountain bike access and diverse riding opportunities on Metropolitan Detroit's public lands through education, communication, and unified action. Working with partner organizations, the MCMBA chapter maintains approximately 85 miles of singletrack mountain bike trails in Oakland and Wayne counties. The MCMBA built and maintains the mountain bike trails at Hickory Glen Park.

Friends of Byers

The Friends of Byers was formed in 1995, in recognition of the need to protect the historic Byers homestead for future generations to enjoy. This group of volunteers began the effort that resulted in the purchase by Commerce Township on September 30th, 1998. The Friends of Byers are responsible for coordinating the preservation and maintenance of the grounds.

Scarlet's Smile Foundation

The Scarlet's Smile Foundation is a non-profit organization named after a little girl in Commerce Township who is fighting a battle with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA). The Foundation is dedicated to making children's lives and their families lives better. Their goal is to build an all-inclusive playground at Dodge Park in 2019 along with an all-inclusive splash pad.

Golf Courses

A total of 4 golf courses are located in Commerce Township as listed below. The location of the courses are shown on the Inventory Map.

- Bay Pointe Golf Club
- Beacon Hill Country Club
- Edgewood Country Club
- Union Lake Golf Club

In addition to the course itself, some of the golf clubs feature indoor recreational facilities such as banquet halls and fitness centers and outdoor facilities such as pools.

Fitness Centers/Gyms/Bowling/Activity Centers

A number of private gyms, fitness centers, activity centers, and bowling alleys are in Commerce Township or nearby including (among others):

- **Lifetime Fitness,** which includes an indoor and outdoor pool, spa, cafe, fitness classes, weigh training, racquetball, basketball courts, squash, etc.
- Anytime Fitness
- Orangetheory Fitness
- Powerhouse Gym
- Planet Fitness
- Wonderland Lanes Bowling
- **Defy Detroit** includes trampolines, slacklines, ninja course, rock wall, zip line, etc.

Sporting Clubs

Three outdoor sporting clubs are located in Commerce Township. The **Birmingham Gun Club** and **Detroit Gun Club** are located in close proximity to each other in the eastern portion of the Township. Both clubs feature outdoor rifle ranges and related facilities.

The **Multi-Lakes Conservation Club** encompasses 151.97 acres on the west side of Newton Road, just south of Dodge Park. Outdoor facilities include a ballfield, rifle ranges, archery ranges, picnic area and horseshoe pits. A clubhouse/banquet hall as well as an indoor shooting range are also located on the property.

Neighboring Municipal Parks

The cities of Wixom and Walled Lake and Village of Wolverine Lake extend into the southern portions of the geographic township limits. Given their proximity to the Township, the recreational facilities within these municipalities are likely used by Township residents. Existing Trails



Non-motorized transportation, commonly referred to as bicycle and pedestrian travel, is vitally important to Michigan residents. Walking and biking serve as both a means of transportation, getting people to important places in their daily lives, and as a means of recreation, better connecting residents to nature and their community. Non-motorized transportation is important to the region and state because it contributes to increased mobility, safety, transportation choices, recreation, placemaking, economic development, and the health of our residents. A few of these benefits are further described below.

Increased mobility and equity. Ensuring mobility options for all is paramount, particularly for our young people, seniors or those physically or financially unable to drive. The number of young drivers in the US has been decreasing steadily. In 1983, about 87% of 19-year-olds had drivers' licenses and in 2010, only 69.5% did. A 2014 Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) study showed that 39 percent of households in Michigan reported someone in their home used a bike for transportation in the last year. A connected non-motorized network provides an opportunity to meet multiple mobility needs. Infrastructure that supports bicycling and walking expands transportation options.

Recreation and health. While some Michigan residents use non-motorized systems as a way to increase mobility, many use the systems for recreational and health benefits. The correlation between land use patterns, transportation systems and public health are being recognized and studied by a number of agencies including the Centers for Disease Control and the National Institutes of Health. There is a movement to integrate public health objectives in transportation decision-making because of the link to increased physical activity and reduction in air pollutants.

Economic development and talent attraction.

Non-motorized transportation contributes to continued economic growth. A 2014 MDOT study on economic benefits finds that bicycling provides an estimated \$668 million per year in economic benefit to Michigan's economy, including employment, retail revenue, tourism expenditure, and increased health and productivity. In order to maintain and enhance economic viability, communities are seeking to attract millennials and knowledge-based workers. According to research by the Rockefeller Institute, more than 50 percent of millennials surveyed said they would consider moving to another city if it had more and better transportation options.

Improved safety. Pedestrians and cyclists are the most vulnerable roadway users. While crashes involving pedestrians and cyclists make up a small fraction of the total crashes in Michigan, they account for a disproportionate percentage of fatal crashes. Incorporating well-designed pedestrian and bicycle facilities encourages predictable behavior and alerts motorists to their presence, thus improving safety for all roadway users.

Complete Streets

Michigan Public Act 135 of 2010 defines Complete Streets as: "... roadways planned, designed, and constructed to provide appropriate access to all legal users in a manner that promotes safe and efficient movement of people and goods whether by car, truck, transit, assistive device, foot, or bicycle."

Complete Streets is an approach to transportation planning — one that supports balanced mobility and the appropriate provision for safe and convenient travel by all the ground transportation modes: transit, walking, bicycling, motor vehicles and freight movement. The context of the road and surrounding land use play a pivotal role in what may be the appropriate Complete Street response. A rural road may not have the same solutions and provisions as an urban road. There is no "one size fits all" solution that can be applied to all roads and corridors.

Facility Types and Terminology

The Michigan Department of Transportation utilizes terms and definitions that are used by the Federal Highway Administration as it relates to the various types of non-motorized facilities. The following are the most common "facility types" and are based on the AASHTO: Guide for the Development of Bicycle Facilities 2012. These are brief introductions to the common non-motorized facility types. Some of the facilities are for both pedestrians and cyclists such as Shared Use Paths and in some cases Wide Paved Shoulders and Side Paths. On-street bike lanes are facilities for cycling.

Complete Streets

There is no one design prescription for complete streets. Ingredients that may be found on a complete street include: sidewalks, bike lanes (or wide paved shoulders), special bus lanes, comfortable and accessible public transportation stops, frequent crossing opportunities, median islands, accessible pedestrian signals, curb extensions, and more. A complete street in a rural area will look quite different from a complete street in a highly urban area. But both are designed to balance safety and convenience for everyone using the road.

Shared Use Path/Trail

- ▶ For use by pedestrians, bicyclists and other nonmotorized users
- ▶ Physically separated from motor vehicle traffic
- ▶ Two-way travel
- > Examples include rail trails and river trails



Sidepath

- Specific type of Shared Use Path that run adjacent to a roadway
- > Set back from edge of roadway or has physical barrier between path and roadway
- > Depending on frequency of curb cuts, may not be safe for bicyclists due to intersection conflicts



Bike Lane

- ▶ On-street
- Designated and marked for use by bicyclists
- > Typically one-way travel in same direction as motor traffic
- ▶ Can be buffered, protected/separated



Sidewalk

- ▶ Separated from roadway by a curb or unpaved buffer space
- Dedicated space intended for use by pedestrians



Paved Shoulder

- ▶ 4+ feet wide
- Provides space for pedestrians/bicyclists but not marked as a bike lane
- Occassional use by disabled vehicles and mail delivery vehicles

Influencing Conditions

In addition to obvious conditions related to land use patterns, density and presence (or not) of non-motorized facilities, there are a number of elements described in this section that can also directly influence connectivity and comfort for walking and cycling. Collectively being aware of these conditions will assist in the development of non-motorized goals and recommendations.

Types of Cyclists

Before discussing factors or conditions specific to Commerce Township that may influence non-motorized goals and recommendations, it is important to understand the general types of cyclists and how design decisions can impact the number of cyclists using facilities. Most people can be categorized as one of four types of cyclists.

The "Strong and the Fearless" are the people who will ride regardless of designated facilities or roadway conditions.

The "Enthused and Confident" are comfortable sharing the roadway with automotive traffic, but they prefer to do so with designated facilities.

The largest portion of people fall into the "Interested but Concerned" category. These people are curious about bicycling. They like riding a bicycle and they would like to ride more. They would ride if they felt safer on the roadways.

Finally, approximately one-third of the population falls into the last category of 'cyclist.' This is the **"No way, No how"** group that is currently not interested in bicycling at all, for reasons of topography, inability, etc.


When discussing or considering context sensitive solutions related to encouraging bicycling as a safe mode of transportation, it is the "Interested But Concerned" group of the population that should be kept in mind. This group represents the majority of latent demand for bicycle facilities. As such, their preference should be given significant consideration.

Ped/Bike Crash Locations

Pedestrians and cyclists are the most vulnerable roadway users. Incorporating well-designed pedestrian and bicycle facilities encourages predictable behavior and alerts motorists to their presence, thus improving safety for all roadway users.

Mapping data (2007-2017) of accident locations that involved a pedestrian or a bicyclist assists in understanding where there may be higher rates of pedestrian and bike activity in the Township. The Pedestrian and Bicycle Crash Maps indicates that people are


The Four Types of Bicyclists




walking and riding in all areas of the Township, but encountering safety issues (regardless of fault) along the major road corridors including Union Lake Road, Commerce Road, Welch Road, Oakley Park, Carroll Lake, etc.

Speed Limits and Traffic Volumes


The perception of risk is strongly considered when people are making decisions about whether or not to walk or bike to a destination. Traffic speeds and volumes are one factor people may use to assess that risk and many times are inversely correlated to levels of walking and cycling. Although studies are showing that traffic volumes appear to have greater impact on leisure cycling than commuter cycling. SEMCOG Data was used to map existing speed limits and traffic volumes in Commerce Township. Generally speaking, the higher speed roads and sometimes the higher volume roads will produce a less encouraging environment, or lower level of comfort, for walking and biking.








BICYCLE CRASH DATA MAP




Pedestrian Crashes 2007 - 2017 (worst injury in crash)







PEDESTRIAN CRASH DATA MAP



Existing Non-Motorized Systems

A widespread effort has been emerging in the State, particularly over the past 10-15 years, to identify opportunities and develop non-motorized trail networks that connect communities to one another. Oakland County has supported this growing movement by providing planning services and resources, taking advantage of the lakes, rivers, public lands and abandoned rail corridors to connect residents and visitors to a number of destinations.

The following text and map describes the non-motorized networks (existing and planned) within Commerce Township.

Huron River Water Trail

The Huron River Water Trail is a 104-mile inland paddling trail connecting people to the rivers natural environment, its history and the communities it touches in Michigan's Lower Peninsula. In several parts of the Huron River watershed, com-

munities are improving recreational access to the river, adding interpretive, way-finding, and historical signage, creating linkages from township to city to village, and seeking creative economic development opportunities. These ideas are at the heart of a "Water Trail".

To coordinate these efforts and extend the idea to the entire navigable portion of the river, the Huron River



Lakes Community Trail

The Lakes Community Trail begins at the corner of South Commerce Road and Oakley Park Road in the center of the Township. The trail then runs south and west through Hickory Glen Park, Clara Miller Park, Maple Glen Park and ends at Gilbert Willis Park. The total trail length is approximately 3.2 miles. The asphalt trail was constructed in the early 2000's and varies between 6 and 8 feet wide. Each community maintains the portion of the trail within their jurisdiction. Several local

safety/side paths connect into the Lakes Community Trail, including direct connections to Richardson Park, Dodge Park and Byers Homestead Park. Several sections are showing their age and will need resurfaced and/or rebuilt in the coming years.

M-5 Metro Trail

The M-5 Metro Trail is an extension of the I-275 Metro Trail and traverses alongside M-5 from 13 Mile Road north to the newly constructed pedestrian bridge over M-5 that's part of the Michigan Airline Trail in the southeast section of the Township. The M-5 Metro Trail is 10-foot wide asphalt and built and maintained by MDOT.


Michigan Airline Trail

The Michigan Airline Trail is a planned cross state trail from Port Huron to South Haven. The trail includes a number of local non-motorized trails that will all link together and generally follow the old Michigan Airline Railroad corridor. Many sections of the trail have been built including the West Bloomfield Trail and the Huron Valley Trail on either side of Commerce Township. The former rail corridor within Commerce Township is a key section of the Michigan Airline Trail and is slated for construction in 2019.

Commerce Township, Walled Lake and Wixom have created a trailways alliance called the Commerce, Walled Lake and Wixom Trailway Management Council. Each municipality appointed one voting member to act in its best interests. The Trailway Council was successful in receiving grant assistance toward the purchase of the abandoned rail corridor. The Council worked to purchase the corridor from Haggerty Road to Wixom Road in 2017. The Trailway Council's powers are limited to the acquisition, development and maintenance of the rail corridor land (approximately 5.4 miles).


The pedestrian bridge over M-5 was constructed and opened in Fall 2018. The trail is slated for construction in 2019.

Other Non-Motorized Facilities in Commerce Township

The Existing Non-Motorized Facilities Map illustrates networks of major trails as well as sidewalks and safety paths that are along major road corridors. Sidewalks interior to neighborhoods/developments were not inventoried as part of this exercise. For the purposes of this analysis, the Michigan Airline Trail is illustrated as an "existing" facility as it is owned by the Trailway Council and is slated for construction in 2019. Trails/paths that are interior to parks and many of which are stone/dirt/woodchip have been classified as Park Paths.

Side Paths/Safety Paths/Sidewalks

There are more than 13.5 miles of sidepaths, safety paths or sidewalks along the primary roads in Commerce Township as is illustrated on the Existing Non-Motorized Facilities Map. These facilities are located adjacent to and parallel to the major roads, generally within the road right-of-way. These facilities have been constructed over time in the Township and are built at varying widths-typically between 5 to 10 feet wide. Some are built with concrete and are traditional sidewalks and some sections are 8-10' wide asphalt paths. Depending on land use patterns and frequency of curb cuts, side paths may not be safe for bicyclists. Bicyclists are typically not safer on a sidewalk because they become almost invisible to the motorist. When a driver turns, either left or right, or into a driveway, they are not looking for, or expecting to encounter a bicyclist. If they do look and see a bicyclist they may still underestimate the speed a rider is traveling on the sidewalkbecause it will likely be much faster than a pedestrian.

Park Paths and Mountain Bike Trails

There are more than 18 miles of mapped park paths within Commerce Township as is illustrated on the Existing Non-Motorized Facilities Map. These include hiking trails within Proud Lake State Recreation Area, loop trails and extensions into parks such as Mill Race and Dodge Park as well as the walking trails along Martin Road Parkway and the 6.5 miles of mountain bike trails in Hickory Glen Park. The Motor City Mountain Bike Association maintains the mountain bike trails in Hickory Glen Park. A number of miles of additional walking paths exist in Wise Woods and Victory Park (have not been mapped to date).

Basis For Action



This section of the Plan is intended to further analyze a variety of factors within and outside of Commerce Township that may have an effect on recreation trends and/or planned improvements over the next five years. This chapter provides the rationale for the goals, objectives, and desired capital improvements. This rationale is based on analysis and consideration of many elements including: current recreation trends, comparison to national benchmarks, demographic trends, existing plans, and results of community, Board, and staff input. It should be noted that each piece of information and analysis contained within this section must be considered as one piece of the puzzle and as one piece of the bigger picture. Each of the factors discussed contributes to the determination of need.

Recreation Trends

Recreation trends occurring nationally may provide insight into activities that can be expected to draw a large number of participants and activities that have shown the greatest growth in popularity. The Physical Activity Council published a 2017 Participation Report tracking sports, fitness, and recreation participation in the US. The data was collected via 24,000+ online interviews in 2016 and early 2017.

Sports and activities are grouped into 1 of 7 categories: Fitness Sports, Individual Sports, Outdoor Sports, Racquet Sports, Team Sports, Water Sports and Winter Sports. Most categories showed a moderate increase in participation from 2015 to 2016. Fitness sports/activities (such as dance, pilates, jogging, walking for fitness, aquatics, stair-climbing, weights) had the most gain, increasing 2% over the last year. Water Sports (such as canoeing, sailing, snorkeling, surfing, waterskiing) saw the greatest loss with a 3% decrease. Team Sports (such as gymnastics, baseball, cheerleading, hockey, soccer, volleyball) continued to gain momentum, adding 2% from 2015 and averaging a 5% increase over the last three years.



National Benchmarks

An additional planning tool available for parks and recreation agencies is the 2017 National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) Agency Performance Review. The review provides valuable benchmarks and insights that help:

- guide professionals in the evaluation of performance of their agencies
- make informed decisions on the optimal set of service and facility offerings based on demographics while also providing comparative agency data from other communities/agencies
- show prevalence of expanded activities and offerings of agencies throughout the nation

Data is a valuable tool but not the final answer in terms of decision-making. This benchmarking data and metrics can be used as a piece of the overall conversation as the Township moves forward. The 2017 NRPA report contains data from 925 park and recreation agencies across the United States as reported between 2014 and 2016. Additional data (by size of jurisdiction) was pulled from interactive tables at www.nrpa.org/metrics.

The data on the following page highlights metrics for the typical park and recreation agency with a population between 20,000-49,999 (as is the case for Commerce Township). A comparison of Commerce Township (using 2017 SEMCOG estimate of 38,170) is provided based on the most recent inventory and latest expenditure and revenue data. This data and comparison is intended to continue to inform the Action Plan and discussions over the next 5 years. Every agency and community needs are different.


10-Minute Walk to Park

In 2017, a new parks advocacy campaign was launched by The Trust for Public Land, National Recreation and Park Association, Urban Land Institute, and supported by the US Conference of Mayors, establishing the goal that all Americans should live within a 10-minute walk (half-mile) of a high-quality park or green space. As noted in the campaign, studies show that high-quality parks provide a wide range of benefits to urban residents and cities themselves. These include:

- physical and mental health benefits, by providing opportunities to be physically active and to interact with nature
- economic benefits by boosting business and helping to revitalize neighborhoods
- community-building benefits by providing opportunities for neighbors to interact with each other and work together to improve their surroundings
- environmental benefits by cleaning and cooling the air and providing opportunities for environmental education


The Park Service Area Map on the following page illustrates those areas of the Township where residents live within a 10-minute walk (half mile) to a Township-owned park. Much of the central and northeast portion of the Township are within these areas as is the southeast corner of the Township.

Community Demographics

The socioeconomic characteristics of a community play a role in the demand for certain types of recreation facilities. By examining socioeconomic characteristics such as population, density, age, and household size, municipalities can identify trends and opportunities that may influence future land use and recreation decisions and policy choices. For example, if the elementary school enrollment in a particular area is growing, there may be a need to plan for playgrounds and children's programs. Conversely, if the population of the community is aging, more recreational facilities may be needed for senior citizens. This section provides a brief summary of the socioeconomic characteristics of Commerce Township that may influence parks and recreation planning decisions.

The US Census Bureau serves as the primary source of data for this demographic section. Census statistics are presented for Commerce Township as a whole, but are also presented for the twenty census block groups that comprise the Township. As a supplement to this analysis, a series of maps have been prepared to illustrate the relevant census data by block group.

Population Trends and Projections

Commerce Township has continued to experience steady growth in recent years, and is projected to continue to increase in population through 2030. The table below shows the historical, estimated and projected growth rates of Commerce Township between 1980 and 2030. This growth rate is an indicator that the Township will likely need to continue to improve their parks system to accommodate the growing population.

Population Density

Population density characteristics can have a significant influence on recreation planning. In general, Commerce Township is a well populated suburban community, making it practical for park facilities to be located throughout the Township. However, there are certain portions of the Township that have larger or fewer numbers of residents, and at varying densities. The Population Density Map shows the population density (people per square mile) of the twenty-one block groups within the Township.

As is illustrated on the map, the block groups in the central portion of the Township are fairly dense, as is the area just north of Wixom. The Census Tract (2010 data) in the northern portion of the Township, around Fox Lake (1340-1) is the most dense with a rate of 3,144 people/square mile (1,651 people live in the census tract and the tract is 0.525 square miles in size). The centralized location of most of the Township's parks generally supports this density pattern.

Median Age

Knowledge of a community's age distribution plays a crucial role in the planning of recreation facilities and programs. As previously mentioned, whether an area is comprised of older or younger citizens will greatly influence such things as the facilities that are most desired within parks. The Median Age Map (2010 data) shows the median age for the block groups within Commerce Township.


The youngest block groups in Commerce Township are just north of the City of Wixom, block group # 1350-1, with a median age of 33.1 and just east of Wixom, block group #1352-1, with a median age of 34.5. Comparatively older populations are found in the western and eastern portions of the Township. The block group with the highest median age (48.3) is 1348-1in the southeast corner of the Township. Consistent with the age characteristics of the different sections of the Township, Commerce may want to consider providing recreation facilities that serve a younger or older population as necessary.

Household Size

A household, as defined by the US Census, is all persons who occupy the same housing unit. A housing unit can be described as a house, apartment, mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room used as a separate living quarters. A trend that has been occurring nationwide for sometime now is the declining size of households. There are several factors that demographers have linked to the declining size. People are marrying later, postponing having children, and having fewer children. Nationwide, married couple families still comprise the largest and economically most powerful household. However, the number of single parent households continues to increase, further adding to the decline in average household size.

Household size is an important factor when making recreation facility and program decisions. A high person per household figure can be an indication that an area is comprised of families with children and thus could justify family or youth oriented recreation facilities. Conversely, an area with a low person per household figure may require recreation facilities more favorable to singles, adults or elderly.

The Household Size Map (2010 data) illustrates the average household size by block group within Commerce Township. The largest households are found in the northwest portion of the Township as well as the area around Richardson Road. The block group with the highest persons per household is 1353-2, with 3.24 people per household. Conversely, block group 1348-1, in the southeastern portion of the Township has the lowest persons per household rate at 2.04. This directly relates to the fact that this section of the Township also has the highest median age. The higher median age and lower household size indicate that this block group features a higher concentration of elderly citizens, households without children, and/or single persons.









Influencing Planning Initiatives

There are several related planning initiatives that are significant in terms of their relevance to the provision of recreation within Commerce Township. Each initiative is described in further detail on the following pages.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan for Southeast Michigan (SEMCOG 2014)

In 2014, the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) and the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) developed a Nonmotorized Plan that ties all of the components of the region's nonmotorized system together into an identified system and benchmarks the system that existed, identifies deficiencies, provides a vision to move forward and actions on how to get there. The 2014 Plan illustrates projects that have been discussed and studied at various levels for a number of years including the desire to complete the Commerce-Walled Lake-Wixom Trail that is part of the Michigan Airline Trail and slated for construction in 2019.

Michigan Airline Trail Master Plan (2015-2020)

Adopted by the Commerce, Walled Lake, Wixom Trailway Management Council in 2015, the Master Plan serves as a guide for the acquisition and development of the former rail corridor into a non-motorized trail. Each community is responsible for operating and maintaining the trailway in each jurisdictions portion of the trail. The Master Plan outlines preferred locations for Trailheads/Gateways at where the trail intersects with Welch Road and Haggerty Road in Commerce Township.

MDOT Metro Region North Bike Map (2018)


The Michigan Department of Transportation publishes a road and trail bicycling guide map for each MDOT region. The Metro Region map was updated in 2018. In addition to existing trail networks, the maps illustrate roads with heavier (oranges and reds) and lighter (greens and yellows) traffic volumes to assist in route planning.

Oakland County Parks Master Plan (2018)

The Oakland County Parks 5-Year Parks and Recreation Master Plan (2018-2022) is a guide for staff and the Parks and Recreation Commission to use over the 5-year period. It outlines 6 major goals:

- Be fiscally sustainable
- Communicate effectively
- Enhance communities
- Improve access
- Manage assets and infrastructure
- Protect natural resources

Lyon Oaks Park in Wixom is the closest Oakland County Park to Commerce Township. Over the next ten years, the County is planning improvements at Lyon Oaks including accessibility improvements, permanent restrooms, parking lot improvements, and natural resource management.


Oakland County Trails Master Plan (2008)

The Oakland County Trails Master Plan (2008) was developed to provide a framework for creating a connected system of greenways and trails throughout Oakland County. The non-motorized system is envisioned to serve a diverse range of users, providing safe and well-maintained linkages to important natural, cultural and civic destinations and other points of interest within and outside of the county.

The development of the Trails Master Plan was overseen by the Oakland Trails Advisory Council, Oakland County Parks and Recreation Department and Oakland County Planning & Economic Development Services. These agencies served in a leadership role in the development of a connected non-motorized system, but rely on the efforts of numerous local munici-

palities, trail commissions, friends groups and property owners for trail implementation.

An important focus of the Oakland County Trails Master Plan was the bridging of several primary "gaps," or critical missing links that exist in the major trail system. One such gap was identified in the Commerce Township area, where the Lakes Community Trail, Huron Valley Trail and West Bloomfield Trail converge toward each other but do not connect. Two potential connector routes, a "Blue Route" and a "Yellow Route," were identified and assessed based on their opportunities and constraints. In the end, in 2008, both routes were identified as options and recommendations for implementation of the connector routes were identified. The trail gap and potential connector routes are illustrated on the Huron Valley/ Lakes Community/ West Bloomfield Trail Gap Analysis Map below created in 2008. Since the Oakland County Trails Master Plan was completed, the Commerce-Wixom-Walled Lake Trails Council received funding assistance to purchase the abandoned rail corridor with trail construction slated for 2019.



Commerce Township Master Plan (2015)

In 2015, the Township adopted a Master Plan Update which amended the 2004 Township Master Plan. The Amendment was comprehensive and focused on responding to the 2013 economic upswing and changing developing patterns. The Amendment includes goals and objectives related to parks, recreation and nonmotorized connections. The goals and objectives are supportive and align with the goals of this Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan and focus on provision of a wide variety of recreational opportunities; encouraging ped/bike connections via Complete Streets, sidewalks, and trails; active recreation uses; improvement of playground equipment; preservation of golf courses; and, collaboration with the local school districts.

The 2015 Commerce Township Master Plan also includes a Non-Motorized/Complete Streets Map (below) that highlights destinations, as well as existing and proposed networks.

Wise Rd Ecological Assessment Study

In December 2006, Insight Environmental Services and Klatt Environmental Associates completed an Ecological Assessment for the Wise Road Property. The report was a thorough analysis of site his-


tory, existing conditions, floristic quality assessment, plant communities, preliminary wildlife assessment, resources and opportunities and recommendations. The report goes into great detail about the environmental conditions of the property, including marsh areas, floodplain, scrub-shrub areas, pine plantings, etc. The findings of this study assisted in the decision-making and

agreements related to Commerce Township purchasing the property from the MDNR. This report should be referenced when considering any improvements.



Byers Homestead Report (Oakland County 2009)

In 2009, Oakland County staff completed an assessment of the historic Byers Homestead property. The report includes a detailed analysis of existing conditions and extensive recommendations for restoration and preservation. The report includes a list of 20 priorities and cost projections for each. The report should be used and referred to when considering any modifications at the Byers property.

Hickory Glen Master Plan (2011)

A Master Plan was completed for Hickory Glen Park in 2011. In developing the long-term vision for the park, a site analysis was completed to understand existing conditions, challenges and opportunities. A public workshop was held to gather input related to needs and priorities for the park. The process resulted in the Hickory Glen Master Plan (full size included in the Inventory section of this document). The long-term vision calls for a phased approach in implementing improvements including elements such as two entries off of Glengary, improved vehicular and pedestrian circulation, improved arrangement of ball fields, addition of a disc golf course, and related amenities such as pavilions, play equipment, wayfinding, etc. Due to the time that has elapsed since development, as well as improvements that have been made at other parks, this concept plan may need to be updated prior to moving forward with any improvements at the park.





Maple Glen Master Plan (2011)

A Master Plan was completed for Maple Glen Park in 2011. In developing the long-term vision for the park, a site analysis was completed to understand existing conditions, challenges and opportunities. A public workshop was held to gather input related to needs and priorities for the park. The process resulted in the Maple Glen Master Plan (full size included in the Inventory section of this

document). The long-term vision calls for a phased approach in implementing the desired improvements including elements





such as two entries off of Glengary Road, improved vehicular and pedestrian circulation, a soccer field complex and related amenities including pavilions, play equipment and wayfinding signage. Due to the time that has elapsed since development, as well as improvements that have been made at other parks, this concept plan may need to be updated prior to moving forward with any improvements at the park.

Forestry Management Plans (2013)

In conjunction with the development of the previous 5-year Parks and Recreation Master Plan, the Township developed Forestry Management Plans (Mike's' Tree Surgeon's, Inc.: August 2013) for 4 of the Township's most heavily wooded parks including:

- Dodge V Park
- Richardson Park
- Hickory Glen Park
- Robert H. Long Park

The Management Plans include an analysis of the primary overstory species diversity, forest health, quality and appearance of each stand, major hazardous or structurally defective trees, observations related to health and preservation, as well as general tree maintenance objectives and recommended plantings list for each of the 4 parks. The results of the Management Plans indicated that Hickory Glen Park and Dodge V Park are the highest priorities relative to tree care needs of the 4 sites. The plan priorities have been incorporated into the Action Program of this Master Plan.

Wise Woods/Victory Park Master Plan (2014)

A long-term master plan was developed for the Wise Woods/ Victory Park property in 2014 (graphic included in Inventory section of this document) with a focus on passive recreation and trails throughout both properties and more active recreation in Victory Park (south side of Wise Road) including a large pavilion with restrooms, parking, dog park, soccer fields, open space, playground and splash pad. A public workshop was held during the development of the plan to gather input related to priorities for the park. Since completion of the long-term concept plan for the park, portions of the Victory Park property (south of Wise Road and former Nike Missile site) have experienced sink holes and unstable soil conditions. The Township is currently in discussions with the Department of Defense to seek a remedy prior to moving forward. Due to the time that has elapsed since development, as well as improvements that have been made at other parks, this concept plan may need to be updated prior to moving forward with any improvements at the park.

Participation Data

Another tool used by the Township when considering improvements to parks and recreation are the trends occurring locally in terms of participation. Commerce has a number of leagues that function within the Township and surrounding areas and utilize Township facilities. Participation data was gathered from each of the leagues to get a better understanding of size and potential needs.

Stakeholder Input

During the development of the 5-Year Parks and Recreation Master Plan, the Township gathered stakeholder input via 3 primary methods: a public workshop, a parks and recreation opinion survey, and the DNR required public hearing. Each of these resulted in input that was relied upon in order to develop the goals, objectives and action program for the next 5 years. A more detailed description of the input methods and results is included here and in the Appendix of this report.

Public Workshop

The Township and Parks and Recreation Committee hosted a public workshop on September 18, 2018 to brainstorm ideas and identify priorities for the next 5 years. Approximately 15 people attended the workshop held at the Richardson Center. Participants brainstormed ideas that were then documented on flip charts throughout the room. Attendees placed sticker dots (3 per person) next to the items they believed were their highest priority. Attendees also noted on a large map their top 3 destinations they do/would like to walk or bike to in the Township.



The results of the workshop are provided below with the number of sticker votes shown in parenthesis.

Online Survey

The Commerce Township Parks and Recreation Community Opinion Survey was an online poll conducted August 20, 2018 through September 28, 2018. The purpose of the survey was to obtain input related to the current use, potential future needs, and support for the parks and recreation system in the Township. The survey was based on the 2008 and 2013 versions in order to be able to compare results over time. The availability of the survey was published on the Township website, distributed via email, posted to the Township Facebook page, and flyer's were hung at the Richardson Center, Township Hall, Library and at each park. In total, 340 people participated in the survey (approximately 100 more than in 2013). A summary of the results is presented here. A detailed summary of the results of the online survey is provided in Appendix A.

When asked about the number of recreational programs, activities and facilities provided in Commerce Township, 62.8 percent (83% 2008; 65.8 2013) of respondents felt that more were needed. When asked about the amount of parkland in the Township, 56.2 percent 53.1 percent (74% 2008; 53.1 % 2013) of respondents felt that more parkland was needed.

When asked about the **current funding level** for recreational programs, activities and facilities, 47.0 percent (56% 2008; 52.5% 2013) of participants felt that more funding was needed.

One survey question was designed to gauge the **current participation level and interest** for a variety of physical recreational activities. In terms of current participation, the following were the top 5 physical activities. Where it fell in the 2008 and 2013 survey is listed in parenthesis.

Public Hearing

A full draft Five-Year Master Plan was presented to the Parks and Recreation Committee for their review and discussion at their December 2018 meeting.

The draft Master Plan was then made available for public review on January 25, 2019. Hard copies of the draft Plan were available at the Township Hall and the Ralph C. Richardson Center. A digital copy was posted to the Township website. A notice was published in the Oakland Press on January 25, 2019 and posted on the Township website, Facebook page and in Township Hall and the Ralph C. Richardson Center, making people aware of the draft Plan and public hearing.

A public hearing on the draft Five-Year Master Plan was held in front of the Parks and Recreation Committee on February 25, 2019 at the Township Hall.

Minutes from the public hearing are included in the Appendix.

Action Plan



The Action Plan details the direction that the Township would like to take over the next five years in order to maintain, improve, and expand parks, recreation and non-motorized connectivity opportunities within the community. The findings and results summarized in the Basis For Action section of this Plan were utilized to develop the goals, guidelines, tasks and capital improvement priorities detailed on the following pages. This section also includes planning recommendations related to expansion of a non-motorized network and improvement of ped/bike connectivity within the Township and to adjacent communities.

The Plan is intended to serve as a guide and decision-making document for future recreation facilities and programs. The Action Plan outlines the improvements the Township would like to focus on during the life of the Plan. The Plan is not intended to solve all of the issues, concerns and desires related to parks and recreation, rather to identify and document them so they can be addressed and focused on in the upcoming months and years.

Current funding and staffing levels at the Township are not sufficient for all of the ideas and desires documented in this Action Plan to be implemented – rather, this plan documents opportunities, desires and priorities to consider moving forward.

Goals, Guidelines and Tasks

The Goals, Guidelines and Tasks from the 2014 Plan were reviewed and updated to assist in providing direction to Township staff, Board, and the Parks and Recreation Committee. Goals are long-term ideals or end products that are desired. Guidelines and more detailed Tasks have been developed to outline more specific actions that will assist in meeting the goals. The Goals, Guidelines and Tasks are intended to be as important as the capital improvement priorities. They are listed in no particular order of importance or priority.

Non-Motorized Connectivity Plan

Commerce Township is committed to continuing to improve connectivity, mobility and safety within the Township in order to provide transportation choices, recreation, contribute to placemaking, economic development, and the health of residents. This Plan includes a long-term vision for connectivity as well as a number of initial priorities and recommendations related to non-motorized improvements, which are summarized here and included within the Capital Improvements Priorities.

This section of the Plan details some general design considerations, resources, and characteristics related to the accommodation of bicycles and pedestrians within road rights-of-way and off-road corridors. This section is not intended to replace the wealth of manuals and design guidance documents that exist. There are a number of design manuals and other guidance that should and/or must be used by agencies, designers, landscape architects, and engineers on how to best accommodate bicycles and pedestrians.

Challenges

Implementation of the Non-Motorized Vision and construction of sections of sidewalk, sidepath, shared use trail and/or enhanced shoulders will be a considerable financial investment with a number of design challenges and constraints in a variety of locations. Conditions that exist in Commerce Township that will add to cost and implementation challenges include (but are not limited to):


- open drainage swales along roads that may need to be enclosed
- removal and replacement of mature trees and vegetation
- removal and/or relocation of resident installed landscaping, neighbrhood entrances, and/or private residential parking pads
- wetlands, lakes, rivers and creeks that will require boardwalks and bridges in order to traverse
- the potential need for easements in some locations to ensure connectivity

The **Non-Motorized System Plan Map** illustrates the **long-term vision** for Commerce Township. The Plan proposes and identifies a number of new sidewalks/sidepaths, shared use trails, enhanced shoulders, as well as locations where existing mid-block crossings (where no traffic signal exists) need to be improved or will need to be added when connections are built.

Lines on the map represent a general vision for connectivity for planning purposes only. As conditions are analyzed in more detail, some segments are anticipated to be modified due to existing conditions, development patterns, cost, permitting, etc. In many cases, the type of non-motorized facility provided (i.e. sidewalk, enhance shoulders, sidepath, etc.) will need to be determined during design.

Road Commission for Oakland County

With the exception of M-5, and a few of the roads that share a border with the surrounding Village and Cities, all of the roads and associated rights-of-way are under the jurisdiction of the Road Commission for Oakland County. Therefore, a majority of the elements discussed and illustrated in the Non-Motorized System Plan will require coordination with the Road Commission. When road improvements are being considered in the Township, the intent is that consideration for **Complete Streets** be given during the design process including the provision of facilities for pedestrians and bicyclists.



Complete Streets

There is no one design prescription for complete streets. Ingredients that may be found on a complete street include: sidewalks, bike lanes (or wide paved shoulders), special bus lanes, comfortable and accessible public transportation stops, frequent crossing opportunities, median islands, accessible pedestrian signals, curb extensions, and more. A complete street in a rural area will look quite different from a complete street in a highly urban area. But both are designed to balance safety and convenience for everyone using the road.

Sidewalks and Sidepaths

A high priority element for enhancing connectivity and walkability within the Township is to systematically continue to complete gaps in the sidewalk/sidepath system along the major road corridors. A number of priority sidewalk/sidepath gaps are identified on the Non-Motorized Connectivity Plan Map and within the Capital Improvements Priorities and focus on:

- gaps near Township parks, schools, destinations such as the library, senior center, Lakes Community Trail and the Michigan Airline Trail
- short segments that, when completed, will connect into a large network of completed sidewalks, sidepaths and/or trails
- gaps in high density areas of the Township that also have a significant number of destinations
- priorities identified by residents that provided input into the Plan
- segments that can be constructed by private entities as they develop or redevelop property in the Township

In terms of preferred design, corridor analysis and judgment will need to be made when design of various segments begins. In general, and where possible, the desire is to have 8-10' wide paved sidepaths installed within the Township. It is recognized that, in some areas of the community, significant lengths of narrower, concrete sidewalk segments have already been constructed with gaps in between. In some cases, it may make most sense to fill the gap with sidewalks or sidepaths of matching width or material. A detailed analysis of the corridor will assist in determining the achievable sidepath/sidewalk width.

In general, Sidepaths are preferred to accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists in the Township due to the landuse pattern and because of the relatively low rate of curb cuts along the major corridors, particularly in the northern, primarily residential portions of the community. Sidepaths and Sidewalks may not be a safe facility for bicyclists where numerous curb cuts exist with high volumes of vehicular turning movements as is the case in the more southern sections of the Township and along more developed corridors.

Sidepath Design guidance published by MDOT (2018) as well as the FHWA Small Town and Rural Multimodal Networks guidebook should be referenced to assist with signage, crossings, sidepath user visibility, speed reduction, etc.

Shared Use Trails/Paths

Shared Use Trails/Paths provide a travel area separate from motorized traffic for bicyclists, pedestrians, joggers, wheelchair users, etc. They are constructed outside of a road corridor and offer a low-stress experience away from motor vehicles. Examples in Commerce Township include the Lakes Community Trail and the Michigan Airline Trail that will be built in a former rail corridor in 2019. Shared Use Trails/Paths are typically 10-12' wide (per AAS-HTO depending on user volumes) with an additional 2' clearance

Existing Example of Sidepath Along Commerce Road




on both sides. Where paths intersect roads, enhancements should improve conditions for path/trail users. In addition to the Michigan Airline Trail and the Lakes Community Trail, a number of additional Shared Use Paths/Trails are proposed in Commerce Township to increase connectivity including:

- Spur into Proud Lake Recreation Area to/from Lakes Community Trail
- Trail within Township owned property that would provide a connection from the Lakes Community Trail at Commerce/Glengary southeast to Welch Road and into the Martin Parkway destinations
- Segment through Dodge Park to connect to Newton Road corridor
- Segment along utility corridor from E Commerce Road to Carroll Lake Road to connect the Library and Victory Park
- Segment through Mill Race Park from Farr Street to Commerce Road
- Further study and discussion to determine long-term feasibility of a trail/path through the ITC Utility Corridor that traverse north/south in the northwest portion of the Township and could provide connectivity between Proud Lake Recreation Area and White Lake to the north

Pedestrian Bridges and Boardwalks

Commerce Township enjoys extensive natural resources including more than 25 lakes and numerous rivers, creeks, streams and acres of wetlands. These natural features also dictate the location of many of the road corridors in the community. In order to implement the Non-Motorized Connectivity Plan, a number of pedestrian bridges and/or sections of elevated boardwalk will be needed. These elements add to the design, permitting and cost of the system. Where a boardwalk and/or pedestrian bridge is needed along a 10' wide shared use trail or sidepath, the bridge/boardwalk should be 14' to incorporate the 2' of desired clearance on either side of the trail/path.



MDOT Sidepath Application Criteria Development for Bicycle Use (2018)



Sidepath (FHWA)


Sidepaths offer a low-stress experience for bicyclists and pedestrians on network routes otherwise inhospitable to walking and bicycling due to high-speed or high-volume traffic.

Shared Use Trail/Path (FHWA)

Shared use paths offer network connectivity opportunities beyond that of the roadway network. These facilities are often located in parks, along rivers, beaches, and in greenbelts or utility corridors where there are few conflicts with motorized vehicles. For paths adjacent to roadways, see Sidepath.



Mid-Block Crossings

There are currently a few mid-block pedestrian crossings (as opposed to crossings at signalized intersections) in the Township that are recommended to be improved. In addition, implementing a number of the segments of the proposed non-motorized network will require the creation of additional, safe, mid-block crossings in order to facilitate predictable crossings for peds/bikes.

As detailed in the MDOT Sidepath Study (2018), the primary goals are to:

- Reduce pedestrian/cyclist exposure to traffic and crossing distance
- Increase mutual awareness and visibility
- Manage traffic speed and flow

Treatment details will be unique to each location and will be determined during design but could include pavement markings, signage, pedestrian islands, curb extensions, stop and yield lines, lighting, rapid flash beacons, HAWK signals, ADA ramps, etc. Several of the more significant crossings may need traffic studies to understand traffic patterns and ensure appropriate and safe treatments are designed and implemented.

Michigan Airline Trailheads/Parking

The Michigan Airline Trail is slated for construction in 2019 and with the opening of the pedestrian bridge over M-5 in 2018, the Airline Trail is sure to be a heavily used and popular addition to the regional non-motorized network. While providing connections to/from the Michigan Airline Trail is a high priority, so is the provision of locations along the Airline Trail where vehicular parking is provided along with a cluster of amenities such as benches, signage, maps, bike racks, as well as potential elements such as bike fix-it stations and/or drinking fountains.

Potential locations in Commerce Township for Trailheads/Parking along the Michigan Airline Trail include:

- At the end of Crumb Road where the M-5 Trail and Michigan Airline Trail intersect
- At the southeast corner of the Michigan Airline Trail/Welch Road intersection
- At the southwest corner of the Michigan Airline Trail/Ladd Road intersection
- Behind the Shearwater Apartments south of West Maple Road

Enhanced/Paved Shoulders

While separation of pedestrian/bicycle traffic from motor vehicles is desirable, there may be corridors and locations that prove the construction of Sidepaths not feasible due to width of right-of-way, significant natural features, etc. Paved shoulders on the edge of roadways can be enhanced to serve as a functional space for bicyclists and pedestrians to travel in the absence of other facilities

with more separation. Volumes and speeds on roads dictate the paved shoulder width needed to provide a safe space for pedestrians and bicyclists (typically 5-8'). Paved shoulders provide a stable surface off of the roadway for pedestrians and bicyclists to use when sidepaths/sidewalks are not provided. They have shown to reduce pedestrian "walking along roadway" crashes as well as "bicyclist struck from behind" crashes (as noted in the FHWA Small Town/Rural Guide). Paved shoulders are advantageous for all roadway users and can also reduce shoulder maintenance requirements.

Wayfinding/Signage

A coordinated wayfinding/signage system along the various trails is desired that would include confidence markers along the way, emergency markers and signage and maps that encourages exploration of nearby amenities and destinations. Signage packages should adhere to MUTCD standards.

Bike Parking

Secure and convenient bike parking at public parks, public buildings, schools, retail destinations, places of employment, and multi-family residential developments will assist in encouraging and supporting use. The Township currently has bike parking zoning requirements in the Union Lake Road and the Town Center Overlay Districts. It is recommended to review options to include bike parking (covered and/or uncovered) provisions in other areas of the Township including multi-unit residential, office, retail, restaurant, hotels, theaters, fitness centers, etc. Additional incentives can be put into place to allow the provision of bike parking to substitute for a car stall.

Enhanced/Paved Shoulder (FHWA)

Shoulders can improve bicyclist comfort and safety when traveling in higher speed and/or volume situations but only when adequate width is provided. If used, locate rumble strips on the edge line or within a buffer area that will not reduce usable space for bicyclists.




Figure 3-1. When adequate width is provided, shoulders can serve bicycle trips along roads too busy for comfortable shared roadway travel.


Promote Education + Awareness


There is a need for education of cyclists, pedestrians and motorists in the region and state using a consistent message and terminology. A number of resources exist that work to help people understand the "rules of the road" while fostering respect between motorists and bicycles to make everyone safer. It is recommended that Commerce Township utilize existing materials to promote awareness and education within the community. These messages and materials can be shared within the Township via Facebook, newsletters, on the electronic sign, email, etc.

Utilize the SEMCOG Walk Bike Drive Safe education campaign materials and include messaging, graphics, etc. in Township publications, on electronic board, via newsletters, via social media, etc.



In addition, MDOT's Sidepath Safety research project (2018) resulted in educational materials with specific messages related to bicyclists and drivers and Sidepaths that should be referenced and utilized as appropriate.





Non-Motorized System Priorities (Next 5 Years)

The Non-motorized Vision for the Township is extensive and will take continuous effort to advance. It is anticipated that multiple segments will be worked on at the same time over a number of years. In order to provide some initial focus, the following priority areas were identified. These were identified due to their ability to connect a significant number of people to a significant number of destinations including parks, schools, shopping, employment, entertainment, etc. While the segments detailed below and highlighted on the Priorities graphic provide an initial focus, this should not preclude other segments from advancing, particularly if conditions change that would make other segments become priorities such as property acquisition, developer or partnering agency interest, etc.


- Complete gaps in southeast section of the Township including connection from Haggerty and the M-5 Trail to Robert Long Park, and the connection from the Airline Trail north to the Downtown Development area.
- Commerce Road Corridor between Union Lake Road and DMC Huron Valley Sinai Medical Center including connectivity to and from the Village, Library, Byers, Mill Race Park, Victory Park, Smart Middle School, etc.
- Complete gaps in **Benstein Road Corridor** from Lakes Community Trail to Airline Trail.
- Complete Oakley Park Road Corridor focusing particularly on the segments between the Richardson Senior Center and Martin Road Parkway.
- Connect the Lakes Community Trail to the Downtown Development area via a shared use trail and boardwalk traversing northwest/southeast on Township property between Welch Road and S Commerce Road.
- Complete the gaps along North Wixom Road and Glengary Road in order to provide connections into the Lakes Community Trail as well as a connection between the Campground and Lakes Community Trail.
- Improve unsignalized mid-block crossings (existing and proposed). Treatment details will be unique to each location but could include pavement markings, signage, pedestrian islands, curb extensions, stop and yield lines, lighting, rapid flash beacons, HAWK signals, ADA ramps, etc.

Funding The Non-Motorized Network Vision

Implementation of the Non-Motorized Vision and construction of sections of sidewalk, sidepath, shared use trail, mid-block crossings, and/or enhanced shoulders will be a considerable financial investment. Four primary methods for funding implementation are proposed for further discussion and consideration by staff, Township Attorney, and the Township Board.

- Creation of a Developer Funded Connectivity Program
 where, in lieu of building sections of sidewalk/sidepath
 along their frontage where none is planned or it would create a segment with no near-term connectivity, developers
 of property in the community contribute to a Connectivity
 Program managed by the Township and used to construct
 nearby gaps in the network.
- Consideration or creation of Special Assessment Districts
 (SAD) or a ballot initiative to assist designing, constructing
 and maintenance of a connected network of sidewalks/
 sidepaths/trails.
- Seek and apply for grant funds to build segments of shared use trail/sidepath that will provide significant and uniquely critical connections. The most viable funds to consider are the MDNR Trust Fund, the Ralph Wilson Fund, the MDOT TAP Program, and Safe Routes to School.
- Remain open to receipt of donations and/or endowments that will assist in establishing connectivity.

Capital Improvement Priorities

The capital improvement priorities for this Parks, Recreation and Trails Plan have been established for two primary reasons:

- to function as a planning framework and guide for the Township Board, Parks Committee, staff; and,
- to enable the Township to apply for grant funding for proposed projects.

The capital improvement priorities table is not a fixed element and is neither all inclusive or exclusive. The table reflects the results of brainstorming, data gathering, analysis and input from a variety of sources gathered during the planning process. It is likely that the priorities and plan may change at some point during the next five years due to unanticipated circumstances such as private donations, changing recreation trends, funding alternatives, community opinion and/or available grants. Funding availability is a key factor in the Township's ability to implement the proposed capital improvement priorities.

The capital improvement priorities table details the desired improvements for the years 2019-2023. The priorities are listed by short-term (1-2 yrs), mid-term (3-5 yrs), long-term (greater than 5 yrs), as well as on-going priorities for those items that should be revisited/evaluated each year. It is difficult to predict desires, funding availability, etc., in the years to come. However, it is important to note that parks and recreation capital projects undertaken by the Township should address the goals set forth in this Plan.

Commerce Township | Parks, Recreation + Trails Master Plan Public Workshop September 13, 2018

Approximately 15 people attended the workshop at the Richardson Community Center. Emily England opened the meeting by welcoming everyone and thanking them for coming to provide input on parks and recreation priorities within the Township. Emily then introduced Leah Groya, livingLAB, to facilitate the workshop.

Leah Groya provided the attendees with a brief overview of the master planning process and the work that's been completed to date. Leah also reviewed the agenda, the objectives for the meeting, and how the meeting was going to be facilitated. Leah indicated that the Township is working to complete a 5-year plan in order to be eligible for future funding assistance and in order to prioritize desired improvements within the community. Attendees were sitting at round tables and were asked to take 30-40 minutes to brainstorm various ideas, issues, concerns and desires as they relate to trails and connectivity. Then, attendees were asked to brainstorm ideas, issues, concerns and desires as they relate to parks and recreation in the community. Each of the small groups then presented the results of their brainstorming session with the large group as a whole and each idea was noted on flip charts. One set of comments for trails/connectivity and one set for parks/recreation. Once all comments were gathered and noted, the flip chart sheets were lined up around the room. Each participant was given 3 sticker dots to place on the trails/connectivity comments and 3 different colored sticker dots to place on the parks/recreation ideas to help to begin to prioritize the many ideas and thoughts that had been generated during the session. Every idea will be documented in the Master Plan, but it is helpful to get an understanding of what attendees viewed as the "hot issues".

There was also a map of the Township on the wall with existing trails noted. Attendees were asked to place 3 stickers on the map to designate the top three places they do (or would like to) be able to walk or bike to. The end result of the workshop was a prioritized list of ideas concerning trails, parks and recreation in Commerce Township (total stickers placed in parenthesis). Those that received at least one "sticker vote" are listed at the top. Below that, the ideas are listed in no particular order of priority.







Q24 Thinking about the number of trails and paths in the Township, do



Q25 On average, how often do you use the trails/paths in Commerce Township






Q28 In what local public school district do you reside and pay taxes?

Q29 Please indicate the range in which your age falls





MOTION by Garbutt, seconded by Wichert, to approve the December 17, 2018, Parks and Recreation Committee Regular Meeting Minutes with a correction to the header on Pages 2-10. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None.

ITEM 1: PUBLIC HEARING: PARKS, RECREATION + TRAILS 5-YEAR MASTER PLAN

Ms. England stated that the draft 5-Year Master Plan has been out for review to the public for 30 days.

Ms. Groya delivered a slide show presentation and provided an overview of the Master Plan approval process. She explained the purpose of the Master Plan, its contents, the input process, the action program, goals and objectives, trail way connectivity plans, design challenges, priorities and next steps. She elaborated on grant eligibility, along with input received from surveys, workshops and the committee. She also noted that capital expenditures are identified as short-term, mid-term and long-term projects.

Ms. Garbutt and Ms. Groya discussed partnering with the State on capital expenditures to make connections at the Proud Lake Campground.

Chairperson Kast opened the public hearing.

No comments.

Chairperson Kast closed the public hearing.

ITEM 2: PARKS COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF THE PLAN BY RESOLUTION

Ms. Groya noted that if the plan is recommended for adoption tonight, the plan would be on the Township Board agenda for March 12, 2019. Once the Township Board adopts the plan, it will be filed with the Department of Natural Resources.

MOTION by Garbutt, supported by Petsch, to recommend, to the Commerce Township Board of Trustees, Adoption by Resolution of the Parks, Recreation & Trails 5-Year Motion Carried UNANIMOUSLY

ITEM 3: LEAGUE AND COMMUNITY SERVICE ORGANIZATION REPORT Inter-Lakes Girls Softball – Tim Bailey

Mr. Bailey shared the following with the Committee:

- I apologize I haven't been able to attend the last few meetings.
- We are in the process of creating teams.
- We will start in about 6 weeks.
- It looks like we will have about the same number of teams as last year, or maybe up one, so enrollment is holding.
- We have our park cleanup scheduled for April.
- I'll get more information to you as it becomes available.

CW3 Soccer - Chris Haney

Mr. Haney discussed the following with the Committee:

- Our annual cleanup is Sunday, March 31st from 1-4pm in Dodge Park. The backup date for that event is Sunday, April 7th.
- Our opening weekend at Dodge Park will be April 13th. The first event will be that Friday for the PeeWees.
- There will be activity in the park prior to that, but no actual matches.
- I will get with Emily on making sure we have extra portajohns. We are looking into the invoices and we'll get those paid up as soon as possible, during the first week of March.
- A construction update: We found a potential source for additional fill. If that pans out, and we don't have wet weather, we will have the fill delivered in the next week or two. Then the equipment will be out to do the rough grade. There's irrigation in Phase 2, so they need to trench the Field #3 area and install pipe. They will charge, pressurize and test in warmer weather.
- The target for opening Field #3 is possibly in September 2019, but to err on the side of caution, it might actually be April of 2020.

Friends of Byers – Dean & Karen Schantz

Mr. and Mrs. Schantz shared handouts and discussed the following with the Committee:

- We held our election in January. Dean is the Chairperson, I will stay as Treasurer, and Mike [Helick] is now our Secretary.
- The 2019 draft event schedule is on the handout. Its our usual schedule with nothing new.
 - o Pictures with the Easter Bunny, Sunday, April 13th, 12-5
 - o WWAM Spring Cleanup, Sunday May 5th, 9-3
 - Ugly Duckling Vintage Market, Sunday, August 4th, 10-6

- o WWAM Fall Cleanup, Sunday, September 15th, 9-3
- Boo Bash Halloween Event, Saturday, October 26th, 6-8
- o Pictures with Santa, Sunday, December 8th, 11-5
- Also submitted is the 2019 FOB wish list with pricing estimates, which includes the following projects:
 - The siding on the East side main entrance of the barn, along with an artist to repaint Byer's Country Store.
 - The barn shed roof will be torn off, redone with plywood, ice/water shield and re-shingled. It was not done properly last time.
 - Water distribution from the well We will start with one post. Irrigation will be run from the well for access to water the ornamentals. We'll have an 80' long hose and the well will have a timer on it, allowing pressure only during the day, which will prevent vandalism. This will allow us to get going with our gardening club.
 - The duck barn has a broken concrete pad. We did the walkway, and now we will break up the pad and re-pour the pad to eliminate trip issues.
 - We will also be painting all the outpost buildings.
 - We have three estimates on lumber. For barn wood, we will go with lverson's again.

MOTION by Petsch, supported by Holmes, to approve the 2019 Friends of Byers Event Schedule. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

Ms. Holmes – I did send information on the first meeting for the History Coalition for Oakland County. They're looking to do a calendar if you guys want to put this on.

Ms. Schantz – That would be great. It's posted on the web page and on our Byers Facebook page. I also put sheets in the barn.

Mr. Schantz – In addition, we cleaned the farmhouse after about a year and a half. It was filthy of course. The only mold I detected was on the ceiling joists. We'd like to schedule additional cleaning sessions, about every couple months, particularly the furniture. Also, during the summer, it would be a good idea to get a dehumidifier in there to keep the mold down. It should be checked monthly.

Ms. Schantz – Plus with keeping the heat at 60, one door is warping.

Mr. Schantz – The front door needs to be repainted and re-screened.

Discussions continued regarding maintenance and repairs at the farmhouse, and the lack of insulation.

Lakes Athletics – Josh Springer

Mr. Springer discussed the following with the Committee:

- Since the last meeting, we cleared out the brush in front of the parking area, out to the road. That was done by Wright Tree Service and DTE.
- We do have an agenda item to talk about the next steps for that project.
- Our registration has been a little below par with February.

- Walled Lake Schools has had like 5 or 6 days off, but the last few days, registration has picked right back up to where it was last year.
- We also have plans for the flagpole installation, signage, and park improvements for fencing and backstops. We can also talk about safety improvements for the diamonds.
- Our park cleanup day for Hickory Glen is April 12th.
- Our opening day is April 20th, the following Saturday.
- We sent in a list of key dates. We need to make sure that the parking lot is graded. We do have a Memorial Day Tournament where teams all the way from the UP come in and play on the fields. We want to ensure the park is in pristine condition.

Discussions took place regarding the brush clearing, increased visibility at the park, and details of the cleanup date, which is being held on Friday night, April 12th, from 4pm to about 8:30pm. Ms. Champagne discussed concessions for the cleanup crew with Mr. Springer.

Commerce Little League – Paul Theriault

Mr. Theriault discussed the following with the Committee:

- We are celebrating our 65th anniversary as a league. The majority of those years have been spent at Maple Glen. It's an exciting year.
- Our opening day will be Saturday, April 27th.
- The day after, we're hoping to hold our second annual 5K race.
- Our registration will be closing in a couple of days.
- We will probably have 50 teams and about 600 players in our house league, plus our Cobras and Warriors travel and tournament teams.
- Last year, late December, we finished up our backstop improvement project.
 That was funded mostly by a grant from Little League International, and partially
 from the Township Board. We've had some great support from the Township on
 the application.
- We're pretty excited that we've raised the backstops on three of our fields;
 Wrigley, Fogel, and Dodger fields. It's a pretty drastic improvement from a safety perspective.
- Our field cleanup day is on Saturday, April 13th, in the morning when we will also pass out uniforms.
- Opening day this year, we're doing something fun. We have the 25th anniversary
 of our State Champion Majors Team, so we're inviting all the kids back who
 aren't so young anymore to throw out the opening pitch and hang their banner. It
 should be a fun day with a lot of vendors, food and burgers. The Committee is
 more than welcome to come out this year.
- We appreciate your support.

Motor City Mountain Bike Association – Mike Kearney

Mr. Kearney discussed the following with the Committee:

- Tim Slabaugh has stepped down, and I will be taking over.
- I'm working on sending over our year-end reports to Emily.
- Last year, our organization logged 2,600 volunteer hours; 221 of those were direct volunteer labor hours at Hickory Glen for trail improvements, including

about ¾ of a mile of added trail on the east side of the property, repair of several features that were deteriorating with age, and some signage repair/replacement.

- Looking ahead to 2019, we'll have a trail day setup in April.
- We will continue looking at the water and wetlands crossing from the east side of the property. We're still trying to secure the engineering resources that the Township requires for the boardwalk or wetland crossing. Hopefully we can find the resources that will be willing to work within our budget.
- We will do additional feature repairs and upkeep.
- We have a new map, so we are getting that put up in the kiosk in the spring, with some kiosk improvements at the trailhead.
- Then general trail sustainability measures on areas of the trails that wash out from erosion.
- You were talking about connectivity during the Master Plan session. The only
 event that we host at the MCMBA is the Milford Bike Fest. We assist in
 maintaining the mountain bike trails that connect from Milford to Commerce
 Township, which pass through and bypass the Proud Lake Campground. We
 have about 50/60 riders. It's our largest fundraiser for the year.
- From our overall chapter, we are up to 13 trails now.
- · Settlers Park was added recently.
- Hartland Township approached us recently looking for us to build some trails.
- The Northville Psychiatric Hospital was demolished, and we can go ahead with building trails on that property.

ITEM 4: PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT REPORT

Ms. England stated that things are going smoothly at the Richardson Center, and discussed the following:

- We are in the process of finding our vendor. I'll keep you up to date.
- Taxes have started with the AARP free tax service. The spots filled up pretty quickly so we have a waiting list.
- We are moving forward with the process for Scarlet's Smile in Dodge Park and the restroom facilities.

Mr. Wichert – How far along is Scarlet's Smile now? Are they about two-thirds of the way there? How did their fundraiser go?

Ms. England – Yes, she is confident that they'll have everything. They want to start building in August. They raised \$75,000 at the fundraiser.

ITEM 5: TOWNSHIP BOARD REPORT

No report in Mr. Berkheiser's absence.

ITEM 6: PARK LIAISON UPDATES

Berkheiser - Wise Woods & Victory Park No report in Mr. Berkheiser's absence.

Champagne - Hickory Glen Park

My park has been handled very well by the gentlemen out there today.

Garbutt - Long Park & Snowy Ridge Park

- They've been on the sledding hill.
- I haven't been out to Long Park lately so nothing to report.

Wichert - Maple Glen

- I did not go out today.
- Tim, did we lose any trees?

Mr. Bailey – I haven't been out there in a few days.

Ms. Holmes – I'd be surprised if we didn't.

Ms. England – Mark has been out cleaning up trees.

Kast - Dodge Park

- Dodge Park is good.
- I did not visit yesterday, but I'm sure some trees probably fell.

Holmes - Byers and Mill Race

• The river is really high.

Petsch - Bicentennial Park

Nothing to report.

ITEM 7: VILLAGE OF WOLVERINE UPDATE

Ms. Champagne discussed the following with the Committee:

- We have a new administrator starting next week. He came from Clawson. You
 may have read about him in the Spinal Column. He's a young guy and he was
 the clerk in Clawson.
- St. Patrick's Day bus trip is March 10th. I emailed the flyer to Emily to put up at the Richardson Center. It's a fun event. They also do the parade downtown, and a pub crawl.

ITEM 8: COMMERCE LITTLE LEAGUE 5K RACE

Mr. Theriault discussed the following with the Committee:

- Last year we did a 5K and one-mile fun run fundraiser. We had 150 people come out for the race. We had quite a few sponsors.
- It was a good fundraiser for us and we hope to do it again this year, the day after our opening day, on Sunday, April 28th. The course starts at Maple Glen and runs through the park, past the Fire Station, into Gilbert Willis, and then back around to Maple Glen again. It is a timed event. The one-mile is less competitive, and the 5K is competitive for prizes. There's food and snacks, et cetera.

MOTION by Petsch, supported by Holmes, to recommend approval and support the Commerce Little League 5K Race and One-Mile Run on Sunday, April 28, 2019. Discussion took place regarding the registration date for the event.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

ITEM 9: LAKES ATHLETICS IMPROVEMENTS (HICKORY GLEN)

Mr. Josh Springer and Mr. Jim Doyle distributed handouts of photos, and Mr. Springer discussed the following with the Committee:

- Jim Doyle is our Field Director. He has been coordinating with DTE and Wright Tree Services to get the clearing done.
- The most important task for us is the second opening, the connection with Glengary for parking. I know it's a more long-term priority, but it's definitely something that is most important to us. I'm not sure what steps we take, or how we go about approval, funding or drawings.

Ms. England – Where are you looking to put this?

Mr. Springer – The second entrance? It would be somewhere on the east side of the park.

Ms. England – Where we've already done it.

Ms. Holmes – Are you talking about relocating across from Laguna?

The Committee reviewed the plans presented by Mr. Springer as he identified the 30' clearing near the concession stand where he was proposing a second entrance.

Extensive discussions took place regarding creating a second emergency exit in the area identified, consulting with the Village of Wolverine as they own the road in this area, and the prior concept plan for a second entrance which was to be located farther down by the path. Ms. England encouraged Mr. Springer and Mr. Doyle to consult with Jay James regarding the curb cut for an emergency exit as proposed. Mr. Petsch clarified that the emergency exit could only be used for emergencies, not for regular ingress/egress. Discussions continued regarding the concept plan, the master plan for the park, the second entrance along Glengary, traffic flow and safety. A berm or split rail fence was mentioned for the emergency exit area, along with discussion of maintenance of the area. Ms. Champagne suggested that a split rail fence could possibly be a Boy Scout project.

Mr. Springer – Our next project is to update the inbound signage in the park, along the right hand side, the 1963 Champs and the boards. We'd like to set up a foundation for four flagpoles; the US flag, our Lakes Athletics flag, the Legends Travel Team flag, and then we're trying to also incorporate the Hawks Football Team. We could also put the Commerce Township flag under the US flag. We need to understand what that approval looks like.

Mr. Petsch – Look at the Master Plan. Let's do this all at once. It's a great idea, but we don't want to have you spend a bunch of money putting in flagpoles and concrete if it does not coincide with the Master Plan.

Ms. Holmes – As Leah said though, it's a concept plan. We can work on it.

Mr. Springer – Right, if we're going to move the driveway 50' to the east, there's no reason to leave that right there.

Mr. Petsch – Let's look at what we've got because that might not be the spot to put it.

Ms. Holmes – In the plan, wasn't there one more field?

Ms. England – You were going to relocate and reorganize.

Mr. Petsch – That was to redo the whole thing in cloverleaf style.

Mr. Springer – Is that in the plan too?

Mr. Petsch - Yes.

Ms. England – The plan covers the entire park.

Mr. Petsch – Review the Master Plan, and then come back to us.

Ms. Holmes – There's always joint fundraising and grants. Also talk to your national associations.

ITEM 10: DODGE PARK PLAYGROUND RELOCATION

Ms. England discussed the following with the Committee:

- I need your recommendation.
- These are just ideas, and the areas shown are not the exact locations for relocation of the old equipment.
- We have to consider potential expansion of the Library parking.

Discussions took place regarding potential locations for moving the equipment, issues with certain areas where it may distract from Library programming, the Library drop box, et cetera. Ms. Garbutt noted that a lot of parents expressed the desire to have the playground by the pavilion so that they could take the kids for lunch there and sit in the shade. Ms. Kast and Mr. Petsch noted that it shouldn't be too close to the main road, or near the running trail, or too close to a heavily wooded area for safety reasons. Mr. Wichert suggested putting a fence around it.

As the Committee came to a consensus, Ms. England added that she would also consult further with the engineers.

MOTION by Petsch, supported by Champagne, to recommend Relocation of the Dodge Park Playground, with instructions to the engineers to put the playground equipment on the north side of the park, as close to the existing playground and pavilion as possible, without interfering with the potential expansion of Library parking.

MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

ITEM 11: CONCERT IN THE PARK

Ms. England discussed the following with the Committee:

• The dates are scheduled after July 5th, every Friday night at 7PM, July 12th through August 16th, for 6 weeks.

- JAG is working on making the entertainment selections and they are working on sponsorships. They will keep us updated.
- The Richardson Center deck is the stage.

ITEM 12: BUTTERFLY GARDEN

Ms. England briefly discussed details of the project with the Committee for clarification on the design. She inquired about the gate, rounded corners, the fence height, and discussed pricing.

Mr. Wichert preferred a gate. Mr. Petsch and Mr. Wichert stated that the fence/gate should be 3.5' high. As for rounded corners versus alternatives, Ms. Kast suggested comparing pricing on the bids.

ITEM 13: BYERS

Ms. England discussed the following with the Committee:

- I'm hoping that Michelle can help with this.
- I was asked to put this on the agenda after the last discussion meeting with the Township Board.

Ms. Holmes – The Township Board sounded receptive. They need to be refreshed on the original plans and options for the park of all the things that it could be. The Board Members are all new since then, and they need to see the report. We need to repackage the information with updates and present it to them.

Ms. England – We can pull the structural engineering reports also.

Extensive open discussions ensued; the Ron Campbell report was mentioned, along with discussion of the property history, suggested uses for the park over time, which had included the library, museum, educational uses, et cetera. As to the farmhouse in particular, restoration versus structural stability was addressed, and the capacity of the building was discussed.

Ms. Garbutt noted that there are phragmites in the stream at Byers. Ms. England noted that they have been treated.

Ms. Holmes reiterated that Byers should be an agenda item again next month, and the reports should be reviewed and updated to present to the Township Board.

Ms. Schantz inquired about the timeline, as this project has seen significant delays. Ms. Holmes explained that the Township Board wants direction in the form of a recommendation from the Parks and Recreation Committee.

ITEM 14: HORSE FARM

Ms. England discussed the following with the Committee:

- We had a long discussion with the Township Board about the Horse Farm property and what we might like to do with it.
- The property is located at the corner of Wixom and Charms.
- Currently, the renter operates a riding stable for trainers and there are 63 horses.
- You might remember that we looked at the property years ago for soccer fields.

- Bob would like to see the site remain with its purpose as a horse farm, but there is repair work that will need to be done by the Township as owner of the property.
- Other thoughts have been to keep the property as greenspace.

Ms. Holmes – Because we own the land, the landlord incurs the costs of the repairs.

Ms. England – Absolutely.

Ms. Holmes – There were drainage issues with the site.

Ms. England – The Township purchased the property through the tax sale.

Ms. Champagne – Could the property be sold?

Ms. England – Yes.

Discussions continued regarding the current use as a horse farm, equestrian teams (a club sport, but not a school sport), leasing of horses to equestrian team riders, other services provided at the farm, the old house on the site that needs to be demolished, the possibility of selling the property, draining and excavation issues, et cetera.

The Horse Farm would be on the March agenda for further discussion. Ms. Champagne suggested meeting at the Horse Farm on March 25th, prior to the next Committee meeting. Ms. England agreed and would send out an email reminder to meet there at 5PM.
