G. Establishment Resolution - 5 & Main Water Main Infrastructure SAD Hans Rentrop, Township Attorney, said the Board can make any changes to the Establishment Resolutions, if needed. Each seeks the project costs, or a portion thereof, inclusive of all administrative fees. They do not specify a term of years, but Continental has requested the SAD's have 15-year terms. You may wish to consider adjusting the administrative fees. Tentatively, we agreed with Continental that the Capital Charges SAD would not have an administrative fee associated with it, as such, the enclosed capital charges resolution does not contemplate administrative fees. However, we also believe that administrative fees for the Water Main and Sewer Main SAD should be fixed and not a percentage of the SAD. You may wish to add a fee of \$6,000 to the total water project cost of \$435,384.48 to cover the administrative costs for a total of \$441,385 instead of leveling the full \$457,153.70 referenced in the Water Main Petition. Similarly, you may wish to add a fee of \$6,000 to the total sewer project cost of \$817,739.81 to cover the administrative costs for a total of \$823,740 instead of leveling the full \$858,625.70 referenced in the Sewer Main Petition.

Trustee Weber asked Treasurer Phillips to give her thoughts on how the Township will be protected financially with the way this is structured.

Treasurer Phillips said, in her opinion, she has no problem with the structure of the SAD's because there is a lien on the property, a performance bond, the movement going forward, and the interest income that we will receive. She recommends a \$6,000 administrative fee for water and a \$6,000 administrative fee for sewer.

Trustee Sovel asked for a timeline for construction on the project.

Jordan Teichen, Continental Properties, said they plan to close and break ground in June 2024, earthwork, water, and sewer are planned to be completed by late fall 2024. Continental plans on the first payment in February 2025. We will start with construction of the clubhouse and that typically will take 11 months to complete following with residential buildings taking 3 weeks each to complete.

Erik Hahn, Continental Properties, Continental's schedule is due to the significant financial scope of the sewer; the sewer is very deep and needs to be installed first. They are posting a 7-million-dollar performance guarantee for the sewer in addition to all the permits that will come after the sewer is installed. Construction of the clubhouse will be extended from 11 months to 14 months. The residential buildings will follow. They are anticipating building 20 units a month.

Trustee Weber –

- Why are we continuing to Table WRC Budget? Supervisor Gray said he met with Jason Mayer and Jay James to discuss what the Township Board would like WRC to present to the Board. WRC will attend the June 11, 2024 Township Board meeting and will present the 2023 actual and the 2025 budget.
- He asked Fire Chief Dundas for an update on ALS. Fire Chief Dundas said the
 first month of the ALS program, ambulance calls were doubled. They are off to a
 good start with the ALS program. With all the contractual changes made, the
 firefighters are working hard and their morale is very high.
- He asked Jason Mayer for an update on the Benstein water main contingency money. Jason said they have not requested anything yet. He believes the next payout application will be the last one.

ITEM 8:5-14 OTHER MATTERS (continued)

Trustee Berkheiser –

- Will there be a traffic study at the Chaldean Church? David Campbell, Planning Director, said they want to look at the intersections of Martin, Richardson, Union Lake, and Haggerty Roads. The church will not generate a lot of traffic during the weekdays, only on Sundays. He will make sure the traffic study takes into consideration the traffic count on Sundays.
- Revenue expenditure Report shows a "percent budget used" There are areas that are over budget and we are not even through half of the year. Are modifications needed?

Trustee Sovel -

- What are the additions going in at Costco? David Campbell said a new fuel center will go in and a series of additions added to the main building.
- He noticed the traffic lights at Richardson and Newton Roads are being replaced.
 What is the next step with the traffic lights in the Township? Supervisor Gray said all traffic lights will be updated by the end of 2025.

Supervisor Gray -

- We are moving forward with the process of 1.6 million dollars for the Commerce Wixom Community Connection (making Glengary, Loon Lake and Wixom Roads accessible).
- Oakland County is selling lockers for \$10 on Facebook.
- We were offered \$500 for a non-buildable lot on Reed Lake. This is for a small piece of land next to a pathway that goes down to Reed Lake and contiguous to the resident wanting to purchase it. The Township Board recommends moving forward with the counter-offer.
- Maintenance Director Mark Schoder received a quote for \$10,000 to repair bad check valves at the fire stations, Richardson Center, and the library. He will get additional quotes.
- He asked for a quote to remove a wall at the maintenance building (old sheriffs' station) to open the bay area.
